<p>Easterhouse Parish Church has substantial land surrounding the building that has the potential to be developed into a recreational space that can be used by the baby and toddler group, After School clubs, Messy Church, Daffodil Club, the congregation and the wider community. Currently the space is mostly used by dog walkers and has high levels of dog fouling. It would be great to make better use of the land and it is an ideal opportunity to nurture intergenerational connections and support the development of a recreational space that can be used by all ages within the community.</p> <p>This would ensure a balanced and varied programme of activities are consistently delivered within groups and extends to outdoors to ensure sustainability long term for current and future families.</p>

By creating an outdoor space, families will be able to enjoy some nature play. We plan to use recycled wood, old tyres, digging a sand pit, have some shallow water play and in addition have raised beds to encourage seed planting with the daffodil club and the baby & toddler group. The space also lends itself to the development of a vegetable patch where there are opportunities to grow vegetables that can later be cooked at club lunches. The area is also ample space for a seating area that people can take advantage of to enjoy the brighter weather.

We wish to extend our services to include outdoor play/activities, to do this we need to provide a safe environment to create a garden / play area. This will increase the confidence of parents/carers and encourage them to use the skills and knowledge (learned in the group) at home and outdoors through playing together with their child.
